

Ajobu of Araromi-obu becomes grade “A” traditional ruler

The Ondo State Executive Council has approved the recognition and upgrading of the Ajobu of Araromi-obu in Odigbo Local Government Area, as a grade “A” traditional ruler in the state.

This decision was taken at the last council meeting held in Akure.

The council based its decision on the fact that the stool of Ajobu of Araromi Obu has a long standing historical antecedent whose contemporaries in the western house of chiefs have been elevated to Obaship Status grade “A”.

Also approved was the appointment of the new Olufira of Ifira-Akoko in Akoko South East Local Government Area, Prince **Anthony Oluremi Olugboja** as Olufira-elect.

Similarly, council approved the recognition and upgrading of the Molokun of Atijere Chieftaincy and Ajamolu of Onishere Chieftaincy to the status of Obaship.

The upgrading was done in accordance with the part one of the chiefs’ law of 1984.
